We are again pleased to report that our school earned a rating of 4 on a scale of 1-5. Compared to elementary schools with similar student demographics, our school is above average. The rating system includes measures in both student growth and students meeting state standards. This approach provides a clearer picture of CPE student performance for parents, teachers and the community.

While the results are good, we still must strive to have all students meet state standards. This year, we will continue to align our instruction to the Common Core State Standards, focus on the RTI model for intervention, monitor student progress closely and implement our best teaching practices. We are particularly excited about our planning & implementation of new math curriculum this year. As more rigorous standards are now in place, it is important that we maintain a sharp instructional edge to help

ensure students will meet those challenges this year and beyond. 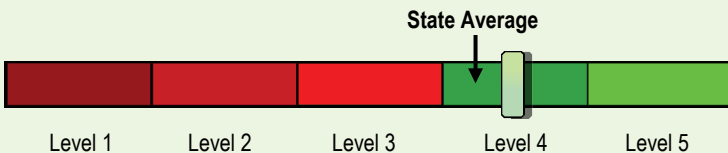

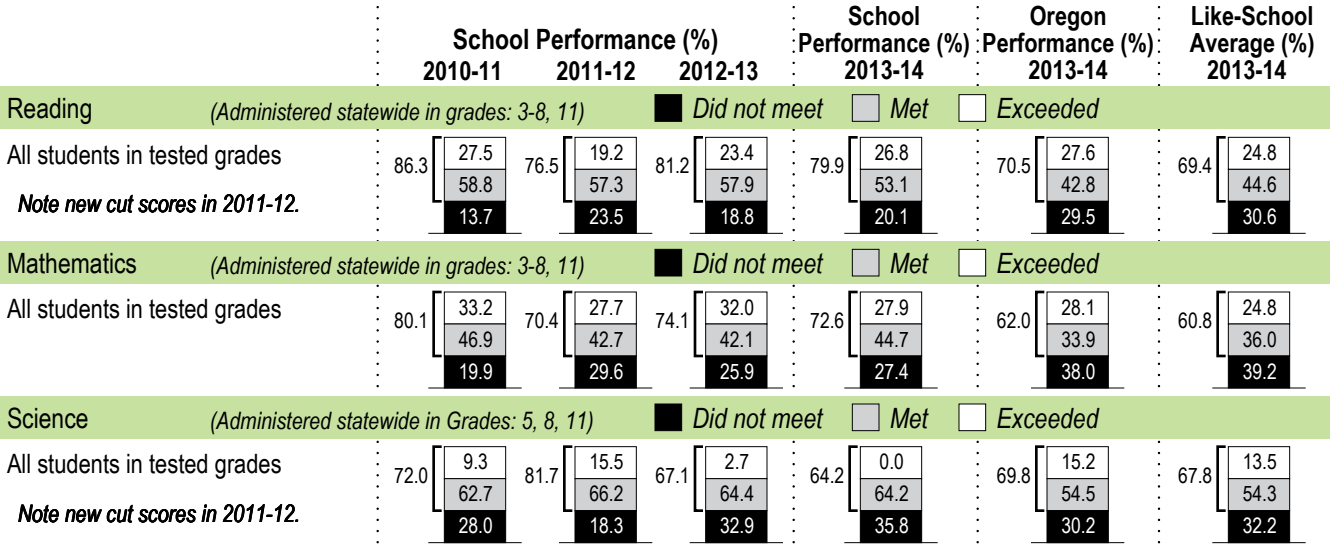

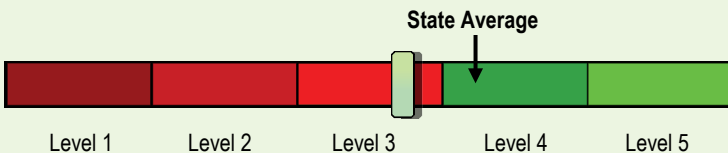

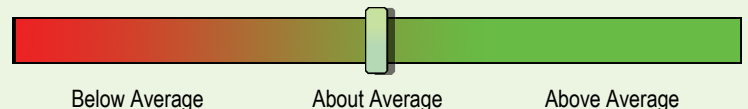

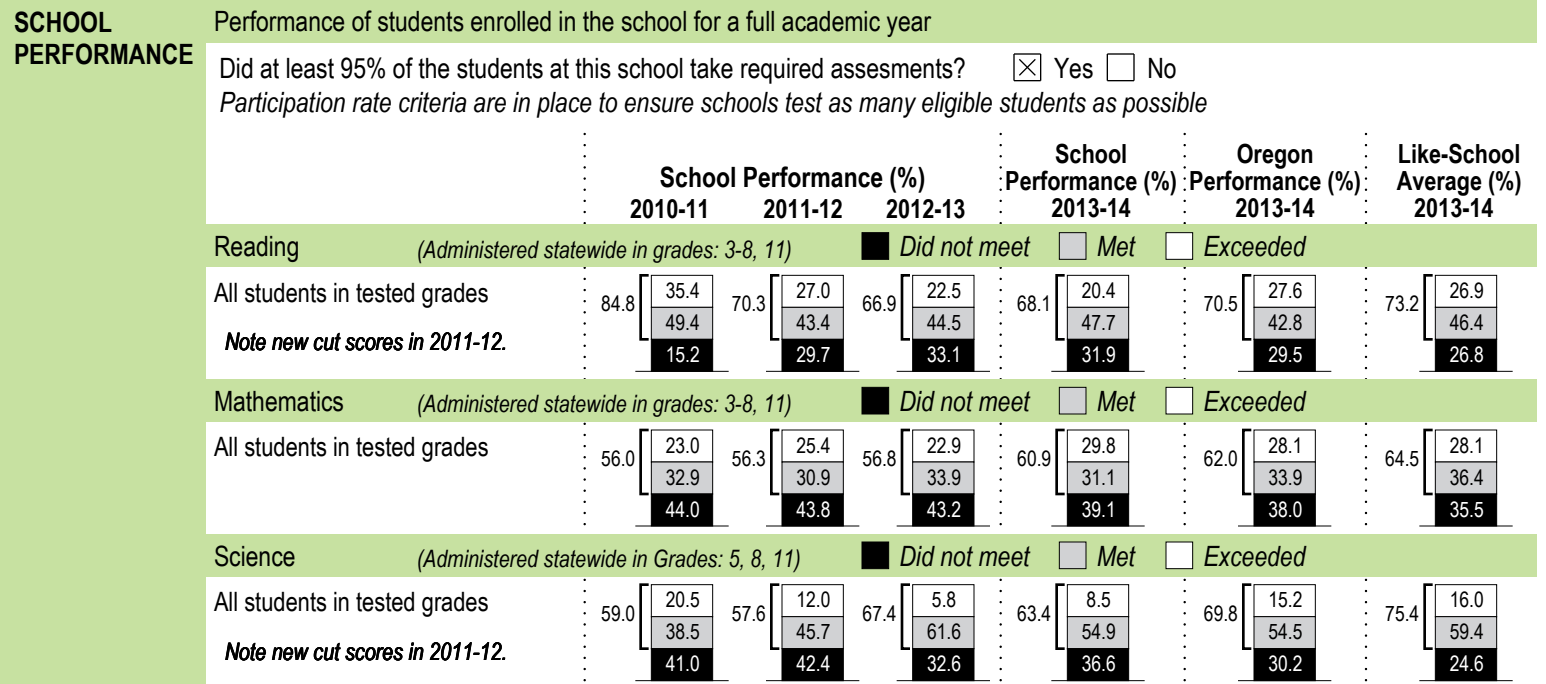

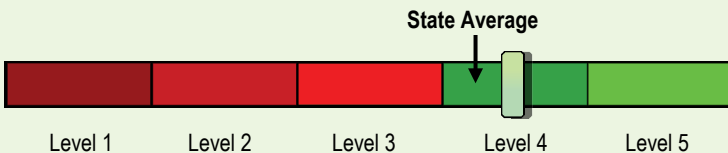

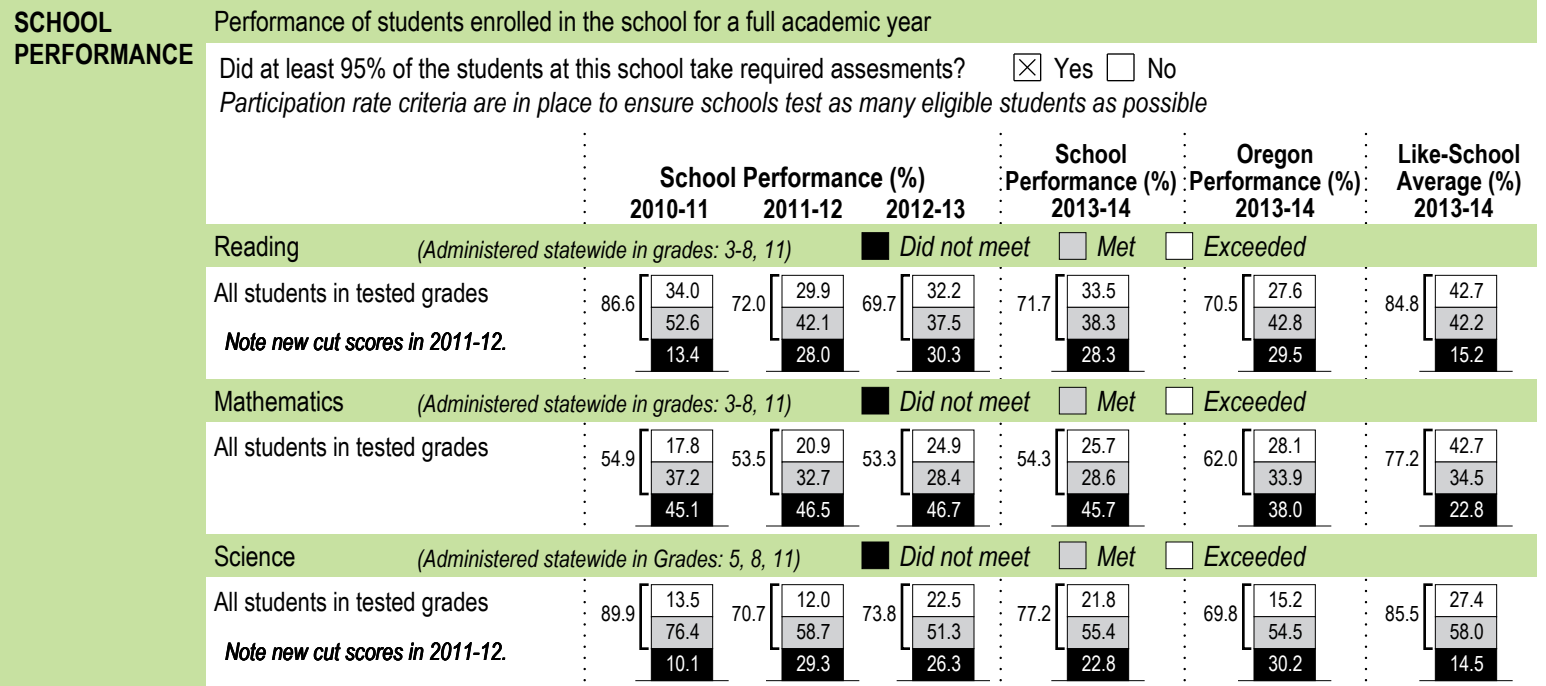

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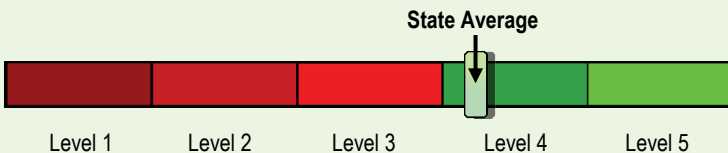

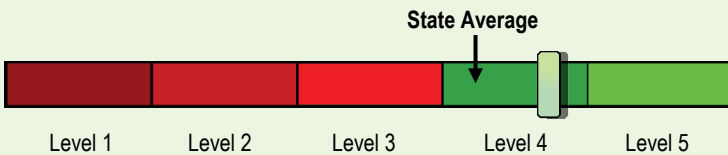

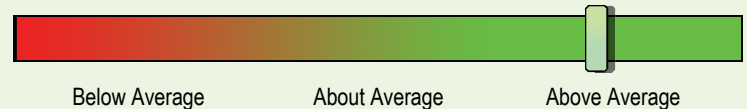

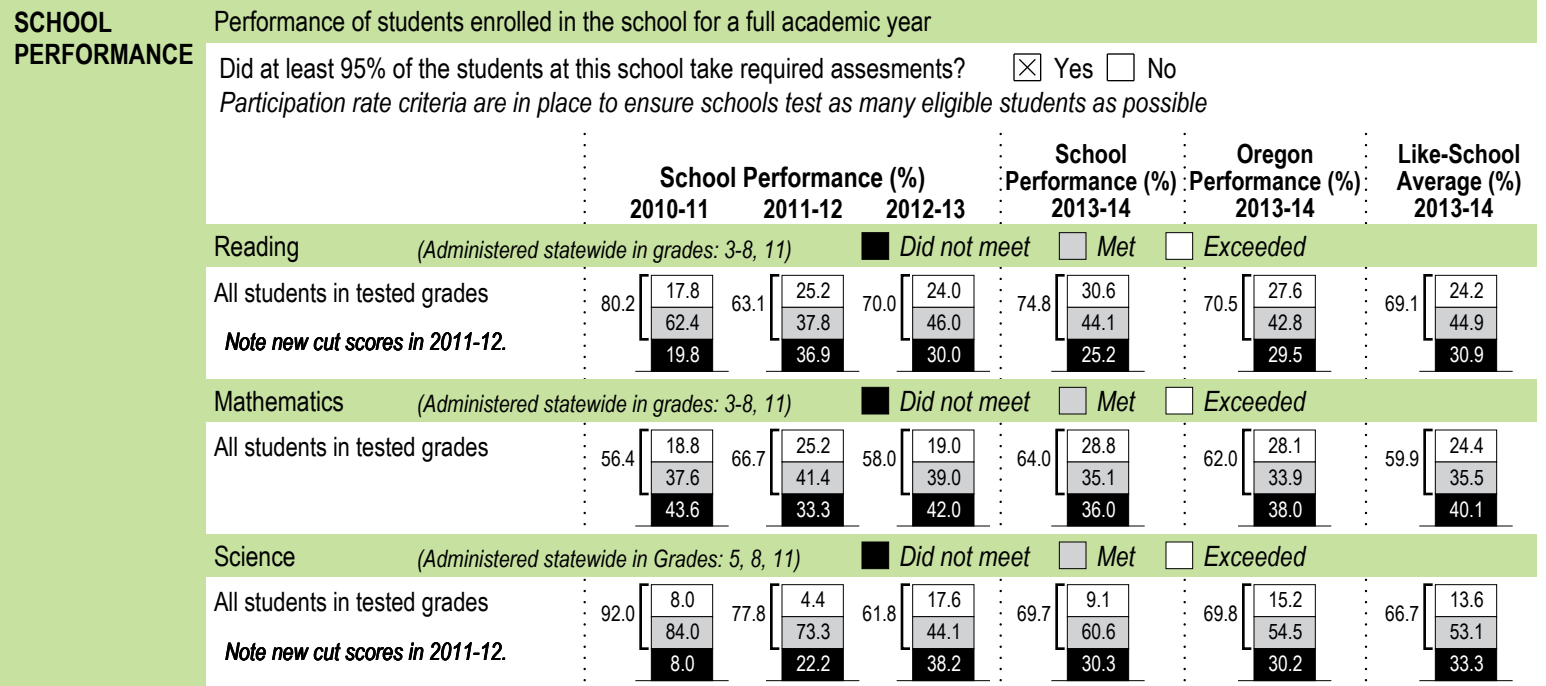
